Dear Friends:

It is a joy and pleasure to write this Summer Newsletter. As my Phased Return to work, after a long illness, draws to a close I am delighted to look forward to being back as your Parish Minister. Your welcome to me during the Phased Return has been magnificent and so encouraging.

I would like to reiterate what I said in the last Christmas Magazine - throughout my period of ill health, with Ulcerative Colitis, I felt sustained by the love and support of my Church Family. I would like to thank everyone at St Mary's for your prayers, cards, gifts and acts of kindness. Every single message of support and kindness was appreciated and gave me the encouragement that I needed at just the right time.

In terms of Church Management and the maintenance of Services and Pastoral Care, I would thank all our Elders and Office Bearers. Special thanks to Rev John Thomson, Rev Arthur Barrie, William Simpson, Rev Les Brunger, Rev Peter Donald, our Clerks Alan Joyce and Stewart Maxwell, our Church Officer Ian Beattie and Church Secretary Margaret McCloy. During my illness, I was delighted to know that St Mary's was in such good, godly and capable hands and hearts.

As we look forward to the days ahead, as a congregation, our focus together will be on Mission to our Parish and growing St Mary's - both spiritually and numerically. If the Draft Presbytery Plan, agreed by Forth

Valley and Clydesdale Presbytery on Saturday 27 April, is ratified by the General Assembly appointed committee at 121, it means that Motherwell St Mary's Parish, Ministry and Building will have the opportunity to progress over the next 5 years without any significant re-adjustment. This is not something to be taken for granted, but an opportunity to grasp. When the next major Presbytery Plan is drawn up [in five-year's time] we will want to be in a position of strength, spiritual health and growth - with a Church Building excellently maintained and adapted for the future challenges of Ministry and Mission in the years ahead to come. All of this will take commitment, hard work and a passion to serve out our Membership Vows. I know that, together, we can achieve great things - with God's help, guidance and strength.

In June we have some significant services to look forward to - namely, our Junior Church Promotion Service on the 16 June and our Summer Communion on the 23 June. It would be great to have the church busy and bustling for these celebratory services.

As the School Summer Holidays beckon [26 June - 14 August], I would wish everyone, of every age, a happy and blessed Summer - whether you are staying close to home or travelling far abroad.

To allow folks the opportunity to enjoy the benefits of the better Summer weather [we can but hope!], our Sunday Services between 30 June and 11 August will be significantly shorter in length. The services will comprise some favourite Hymns, prayers and a Short Reflection and should last no longer than 30-35 minutes.

WORK PARTY

We are up and running (well, perhaps not running) for another session. A new recruit to the Work Party is a rarity. However, I am pleased to advise that Tom Stewart has joined us. I said in the last magazine that as a result of works planned to be undertaken internally, under the supervision of the Property Committee, there was not a great deal for the Work Party to undertake. Externally, we have undertaken the endless task of weeding, and tidying the church grounds. Thanks to an idea from David Maxwell we have built 2 external planters, which will be planted by the Junior Church towards the end of May. We have agreed to undertake some work to the Manse Garden. In this respect, we have already met with the Minister, to agree the extent of the works. We are planning to commence these works in early June.

FINANCE REPORT (to 30 April 2024)

I reported to the Board recently that our income was down on the same period in 2023. Costs have increased alarmingly, particularly in heating and lighting. Our previous fixed rate prices in both gas and electricity have now ended and with the new agreement our costs have dramatically increased. An example of this is that for the whole of last year we paid just over £6000 for both gas and electricity combined whereas in this year our spending is estimated to be £10,000 alone for electricity.

I would urge members to continue to assess what they give and to take advantage of the Gift Aid Scheme which generates a huge amount of money and allows us in most years to almost balance the books. It is easy to sign up for this. If you are a tax payer you can claim Gift Aid benefits for the Church by simply filling in a form then returning it to the office and we make the claims. It is a very simple process. We receive from the Government an additional 25% extra, based on your contribution, in tax recovered.

We are about to embark on a major fund raising campaign as described in the accompanying letter with your magazine. This campaign and the reasons for it are outlined in the letter.

As always I ask for your support in all financial matters and am pleased with the level of support given to myself and the Finance Committee over the years. We now embark on a new stage in our history by consolidating our position as a stand alone Church with a full time Minister. To do that we have to make sure that our buildings stand up to the scrutiny of the Presbytery Property Committee who are long overdue a visit.

Over the next few years before the next Presbytery Plan we must take steps to improve the fabric of our property to ensure that we cannot be closed down or joined up with another Church. This fund raising exercise is the beginning of this process.
