In 2019 and in the early months of 2020, our Kirk Session and Congregational Board worked very hard on a Mission Plan for the first 5 years of the new decade. The plan was visionary, far reaching and exciting. It was eventually adopted by the whole congregation in February 2020 and called: "Vision 2020+". Sadly, due to several factors, including Covid, Presbytery Planning and my ill health leave, this plan [as a whole] has never been fully realised. Many of its aims have been achieved but others remain to be explored.

As a congregation we need a new Mission Plan, and the Kirk Session and Board will start this process in the Autumn. It is hoped that it will be ready for the start of 2025 and will take our congregation forward in faith, hope and love in the 5 years ahead.

It will be a practical but ambitious plan, and I look forward to sharing more with you in the weeks and months ahead.

Currently, we are undergoing a Finance Campaign to raise £200,000 for a greatly needed new heating system for our Sanctuary. This campaign involves a three-pronged approach: direct giving, congregational fundraising events and seeking grant funding. I commend this Finance Campaign to the whole congregation and thank you for your participation so far.

As Parish Minister, I wish you all well in the weeks and months ahead as we journey though Autumn towards the start of a new Christian Year in Advent.

FINANCE REPORT (to 31st July 2024)

We are now more than halfway through this year's budget and signs are that we have anticipated where our difficulties would arise. Expenditure has greatly increased due to large increases on our gas and electricity bills.

I am pleased to let you know that we have had a small increase in the level of giving on a monthly basis. It is a small increase of 1.5% (an increase of £770 on the 2023 figure). This is an encouraging development.

2024 FABRIC APPEAL

Our plan is to raise £200,000, in as short a period as is possible, to replace the heating system within the Sanctuary and improve the heating elsewhere in our property. We will raise the money through direct giving, tax recovered through Gift Aid, grants from a variety of organisations and events planned throughout this year and next. The first of these events is on 14th September in the Church halls and the hope is that this will have the support of our Congregation and the Community.

We have raised £8,205 over June and July and we are grateful to everyone who has so far contributed.

Getting there.... Day 1

With 18 boys and 10 officers (all resplendent in our new pale blue BB hoodies), the convoy of 2 minibuses and the Chapman's offroader and trailer we managed to load up and ship out all our camping stuff and luggage for 5 days of adventure as we headed for Badaguish just outside Aviemore in the Cairngorms for our 2024 Summer Camp.

After a lunch stop in Aviemore we descended on Badaguish and began the process of making ourselves at home - 9 tents had to go up, the kitchen had to be organised, our travelling crockery, cutlery and utensils washed, the mammoth online shop had to be unpacked and the tuck shop retail outlet needed stocked and organised.

At Badaguish we have a great set-up that gives us best of both worlds - plenty of flat dry camping ground complemented by indoor cooking and dining facilities and a modern toilet/shower block.

The boys made an excellent job of setting up our tents under the careful guidance of Mr Greenhorn so after an afternoon of settling in we enjoyed our first meal together and then set off for a stroll down to Loch Morlich.

The Hillwalk....Day 2

Day 2 is the traditional camp hillwalk and this year we returned to a walk we last did in 2016 - the Meall a' Bhuachaille circular. This is a brilliant walk that starts and ends at the campsite and loops around the hills behind that campsite.

It was a stunning 15 kilometre walk in very windy conditions at times - between 2 of the peaks we had a great view of the campsite and Mr Reid who was at the campsite was able to capture a great photo of us on the horizon!


