#### Dear Friends:

It is a pleasure to write this short introduction to our Summer Edition of St Mary's Parish Church Bulletin. The weather over the past few weeks of late Spring has been wonderful - I've even got a bit of a Scottish Suntan! A few folks have remarked to me 'that's our Summer'. Let's hope, though, that there is still more lovely weather to come - so that we can enjoy the glories of God's Summer gifts - illuminated by bright sunshine. In Summer, particularly enjoy the smell of the Manse Garden Roses on a bright, sunny day. God's creation is truly glorious - in myriad ways.

In recent weeks, since the Spring Bulletin, St Mary's Parish Church has had some wonderful achievements.

On Sunday 23 March, we were visited by representatives from Eco-Congregation Scotland and due to the inspirational work of our Y-Zone and Eco Team we have been awarded a Silver Eco-Congregation Award. We had been aiming for a Bronze Award, but Eco Congregation Scotland thought that we had surpassed the Bronze criteria and awarded Silver. This is a significant achievement, and I am so grateful to all who have made this possible. We do not rest on our laurels, though, and in the days ahead, led by our Eco Warriors, we will continue to seek to make St Mary's Parish Church as eco-friendly and environmentally aware as we can.

On Friday 9 May, at the Annual Battalion Review, our 13<sup>th</sup> Motherwell Boy's Brigade were rewarded for all their hard work, fun, and enthusiasm over the past year. Our Junior Section won the Matt Walker Rosebowl for the second year in a row and our Company Section were named Battalion Flag Champions for 2025. As Parish Minister, and Boy's Brigade Chaplain, I am immensely proud of all our boys. I am also hugely grateful to all our dedicated Officers - led by Captain Stewart Maxwell.

At last night's Kirk Session Meeting [Wednesday 21 May] it was also announced that our Street Food Outreach Project has been given a grant of £500 from the Presbytery of Forth Valley and Clydesdale. This is a wonderful project, led by a small and dedicated team, which reaches out to some of the most vulnerable people in our town with the love of Jesus. Thank you to Presbytery for the generous grant.

In the past few weeks, we have also marked some significant events as a Congregation. On Sunday 11 May, Rev John Thomson and Rev Arthur Barrie led a very poignant and beautiful service marking the anniversary of VE Day. Then on Sunday 18 May, I had the joy of leading a service marking the 80th Anniversary of Christian Aid. If you have not already managed to give a donation to Christian Aid's vital work, there is still plenty of opportunity. Social events are always popular at St Mary's, and we have had several successful and fun-filled fellowship events in recent weeks. I'd like to pick out a couple for special mention. On Tuesday 22 April, Renée Turner organised a hugely enjoyable Tea Dance - which saw over 100 attendees. Thank you, Renée. Then on Monday 19 May, the Events Action Team held a very successful evening event entitled: "A TRIP DOWN MEMORY LANE". It was an opportunity to celebrate the history of our wonderful

congregation. The proceeds of both these events [over £1000] have been donated to our Fabric Appeal for our Heating System. The Finance and Property Team are working hard on this project and on other vital and aspirational projects to make St Mary's Parish Church Building an ever more safe, comfortable and versatile place for our congregation, parish and community today and in the days ahead.

In the last Bulletin, I gave some details about the new Unitary Constitution under which St Mary's Parish Church now operates. In essence, the Kirk Session is solitary body which deals with all church business: fabric, finance, and all spiritual matters.

The Kirk Session has created and delegated smaller Teams to take care of specific areas of Church business: Business Property; Administration; Finance and Communications; Events Action; Pastoral Care; Mission and Outreach; Children, Youth and Young Adult Development; Ecology and Environmental Work; and Discipleship and Training. These smaller Teams comprise both Elders and Congregational Members. The Teams are still in the early stages of their work but are already doing great work. For Congregational information, the Teams are each led by a Convenor. The Convenors are:

Finance and Property: Mr Ian Beattie

Communications: Mr Stewart Maxwell - Stewart is covering this role temporary until we find a full-time Convenor for this vital Team.

Youth and Young Adult Development: Mrs Hilary Kidd

Eco Team: [Contact: Mrs Elaine Neilson]

Under new Church Legislation passed at this year's General Assembly, Kirk Sessions will be responsible for creating a Five-Year Action Plan - which is revisable on a yearly basis and then submitted to Presbytery for information and approval. The key sections in the new Five-Year Action Plan fit in almost perfectly with the Team Structure the Kirk Session has created. Please pray for our Kirk Session and Teams as they continue the work of leading our congregation forward in faith in the years ahead.

Under Charity Law, the it is now responsibility of the Eldership [titled 'Trustees' for official charity business] to approve the Annual Church Accounts and Report for OSCR and the National Church. Our Accounts were approved at February Session Meeting. Kirk Congregation still have an opportunity to examine the accounts to make sure that they are happy with the work being carried out by our 'Trustees' on behalf of St Mary's Parish Church. An Annual General Meeting must be held before 30 June each year. This year, our Annual General Meeting will be held at the end of our Communion Service on Sunday June. It would be wonderful worshippers could stay for this meeting. The Annual Accounts will be available 2 weeks before the meeting to examine. This means that the meeting itself should be relatively short. In future years, we may revert to having the Annual General Meeting on a Week-Night - perhaps with some food and entertainment.

On Sunday 22 June, we will celebrate the children and young people of our Junior Church and Y-Zone in a special service. Then on Sunday 29 June, we will share in the Sacrament of Baptism. The Short Summer Services begin from the first Sunday in July until mid-August. Helen and I are due to become grandparents [for the first time] in mid-July, and I am thinking of looking at Bible stories of babies and children as a Summer Theme.

As I end this letter, I wish you all a very blessed Summer.



#### Thank you for your continued support

Our cash donations have totalled £530 this year so far and estimated donations of food of around £500.

Motherwell Foodbank operates from the Maranatha Centre in Glencairn Street once each week on a Thursday morning. Those in need can visit to pick up a food parcel, eat a free breakfast or get a haircut. The team of 25 volunteers who run it also offer support with toiletries, clothing and pet food. Our local Citizens Advice Bureau has a desk to offer free advice. Rather than question how as a society we find ourselves having to provide food and effectively ration it, we simply respond to the need, just as a first aider would assist someone who is injured. Thank you for your support for this ongoing project and we hope if you are able you can continue to donate cash and food.

While it is nice to have success as a Company it is particularly pleasing to see boys within the Company achieve special individual awards.


