Phase 2


Sanctuary improvements/upgrades. At present these are only fact finding as no definite commitments have been made to any or all of these suggestions.

Selected project updates

Food Bank

In the last magazine we highlighted the huge need met by the Motherwell Foodbank. We had a special focus on the work of the Foodbank at the church service on 22 June and we were delighted to collect £537 in cash and an estimated £200 in food. Other donations in the last couple of months have taken the support for the Foodbank in this calendar year to just under £1,700 in cash and an estimated £1.000 in food.

Andrew Ewart of the Motherwell Foodbank told us, "A huge 'thank you' yet again to the wonderful congregation of St Mary's Parish Church for your very kind donations of food and money. It's a great source of encouragement for our work in the community".

The work of the Foodbank goes on and we hope if you are able you can continue to donate cash and food.

Avondale Care Home Worship Services

The services have continued throughout the summer and have been very well attended by the residents at Avondale. The assembled congregation participate in the praise with great gusto! Thank you to Janette McPherson for accompanying us on the keyboard.

Christian Aid

At the various activities and collections arranged in Christian Aid week, St Mary's has contributed significant cash donations to the Christian Aid effort. Hazel Graham champions the activities of Christian Aid in our Church and represents us on the joint Motherwell Churches' Christian Aid committee. Hazel passes on the gratitude of the committee for our fantastic contribution of £750.

The Strawberry Tea held in June at the Kirk at the Cross was a successful event too and this raised just over £300.

Street Project

The team continue to work closely together to ensure we cover the town centre every week and share experience on who we have met and where we met them. This is important because it helps to get to know them better and understand the challenges they face. It also means we can react to changes; we find it more common now for people to be sitting outside supermarkets whereas in the past it would be in the precinct. So far this year we have used around £300 from the Presbytery grant and our own matched funding to provide food and clothing to those in need.

Reach Out Project - showing and sharing God's love in action

Jemma Henderson and Joanne Morrison

Reach Out is a locally registered charity based at North Motherwell Parish Church. It is comprised of 31 volunteers from various churches in the Motherwell area, including several members of St Mary's congregation.

Reach Out was set up in 1999 by members of the Ministers' Fraternal as a project for the Millenium to provide a meal for rough sleepers in the Motherwell area. It was originally based in the Maranatha Centre where a meal was organised once a week. Reach Out has operated from various premises over the years; the Mission Hall in Forgewood, the YMCA and the Ebeneezer Hall

The mission of Reach Out is to support individuals in need within North Motherwell and the surrounding communities by providing food and friendship; being a listening ear without preaching or judging.

Every Wednesday evening at North Motherwell Parish Church, a team of 6 volunteers prepare and serve a hot, two-course meal along with hot and cold beverages to guests. Our guests often face challenges such as addiction, mental health issues, loneliness, or lack the means to prepare a nutritious meal on their own. The number of guests varies each week but we typically welcome around 15-30 people including families with young children, older adults, and pensioners. All enjoy a good catch up over a



'home cooked' meal and at the end of the evening guests are given a shopping bag full of non-perishable food items and toiletries and most weeks there are clothing items available.

Guests always greatly appreciate the hospitality and are very thankful to the volunteers.

The highlight of the Reach Out calendar is our Christmas Party Night. Guests are invited along and receive a three-course Christmas dinner. The party games certainly bring out the competitiveness of the guests (and volunteers!) and it is a wonderful night filled with joy, fun, fellowship and happiness

Within St Mary's congregation we also provide lasting and sustainable support for Reach Out through the Toiletry Bank. This has been an incredible addition to Reach Out's work which has received much gratitude from guests and enthusiasm from volunteers, so much enthusiasm that volunteers have keenly offered shampoos and conditioners to guests without hair and toothpaste to guests with no teeth! This has been the source of much hilarity among both

volunteers and guests and has added another dimension to the friendship and support for guests.

All volunteers, including those from our congregation, display a real duty of care to guests and are keen to offer guests support and advice with one volunteer recently referring a guest to Citizen's Advice when they became upset and distressed over financial worries whilst another volunteer recently walked a guest to a relative's house after they became quite unwell. These are small stories which weave through the fabric of Reach Out and are typical of the actions of volunteers and the care and compassion that they show.

There are many stories from Reach Out that can be told but the lasting kinship and understanding that has developed between volunteers and guests is by far the biggest story.

Your continued support for Reach Out is invaluable and is greatly appreciated by all who join us on a Wednesday evening. If you wish to volunteer please contact us via the church email office@stmarysmotherwell.org.uk and you can donate to the Toiletry Bank by leaving donations within the church kitchen where they will be collected by a volunteer within the congregation and distributed appropriately.

To support communication with our members we have prepared a small card giving contact details should elders call and you are not at home. This will facilitate members contacting the church who need or would like a further visit. In addition, we are piloting a new church pew card which again will allow people to make contact with their elder or the Minister.

At time of writing we are hopeful that all members of the Pastoral Care Team will have undertaken Safeguarding Training by the end of September.

As the Autumn Session approaches we will be able to commence visits which will support and enhance the care our Minister and Elders currently provide.

All members of the team look forward to becoming actively involved in providing Pastoral Care where we will have an increasing opportunity to meet with church members.

Getting there.... Day 1

With 22 boys and 9 officers (all resplendent in our new royal blue BB hoodies), the convoy of 2 minibuses and the Land Rover with Chapman's trailer we managed to load up and ship out all our camping stuff and luggage for 5 days of adventure as we headed for Badaguish just outside Aviemore in the Cairngorms for our 2025 Summer Camp.

After a lunch stop in Aviemore we descended on Badaguish and began the process of making ourselves at home - 10 tents had to go up, the kitchen had to be organised, our travelling crockery, cutlery and utensils washed, the mammoth online

shop had to be unpacked and the tuck shop retail outlet needed stocked and organised.

At Badaguish we have a great set-up that gives us best of both worlds - plenty of flat dry camping ground complemented by indoor cooking and dining facilities and a modern toilet/shower block.

The boys made an excellent job of setting up our tents under the careful guidance of Mr Greenhorn (after a bit of alignment adjustment!) so after an afternoon of settling in we enjoyed our first meal together and then set off for a stroll down to Loch Morlich.

Day 2 is the traditional camp hillwalk and this year we returned to a walk we last did in 2018 - the Cairngorm northern corries. This is a brilliant walk that starts and ends

at the visitor car park on Cairngorm mountain and loops around taking in 3 Munros. It was a stunning 12 kilometre walk in gorgeous weather conditions (some of us got rather sunburned...) and we secured a group photo at the Cairngorm weather station with the Battalion Championship Flag! The views throughout the walk were amazing and the boys did very well on a tough walk.

Activity Days....Day 3 & 4

Monday and Tuesday were both days of organised activities where the main event of the day was provided by an outdoor activity company. This year we made a hybrid arrangement - we partnered with Able2Adventure who laid on an excellent set of activities for us on the Monday and the Tuesday morning - paddleboarding has become a favourite activity as has the gorge walking/jumping on the River Feshie.

On the Tuesday afternoon we were looked after by the folks at Loch Insh water sports where we spent a few hours on their Jungle Float in the middle of the Loch. The Jungle Float is a floating platform equipped with slides, trampolines and diving platforms and best seen on the photo page! It was another glorious afternoon and the boys (and officers) had a ball jumping, diving, sliding and bouncing off the Jungle Float into the Loch.

What else?

In between all the planned activities the boys were kept entertained/busy by our staff team in football competitions, a quiz night and an indoor games night.

A TRIP DOWN MEMORY LANE

On the sunny Monday evening of 19 May we took a Trip Down Memory Lane and with the help of many people, we hosted a nostalgic evening of shared memories & stories of days gone by. The Woman's Guild, Guides, Brownies & Rainbows, Choir, Boys Brigade, Church and Y-Zone exhibited photographs, uniforms, film footage etc and it's fair to say these well-established groups were not short of memorabilia, fascinating information, and amusing photographs. We had a Treasure Hunt, Lucky Year squares, and Who is the Baby activities which proved sufficiently challenging.

A semi-filled timeline charting 111 years, was laid out down the middle of the Avon Hall to allow people to share items and note memories and stories. This included the laying of the foundation stone in 1914, the opening of the new hall in the 50's, our 75year anniversary concert, the ordination of baptismal register, cookery ministers, books, lockdown activities and more recently our Eco Award.
